The frigid weather on the weekend of February 20 & 21, 2015 was not enough to deter the participants of the annual Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum's Ride and Show.

Temperatures as low as -34 degrees greeted the hardy group of antique and vintage snowmobilers who turned out for the 23rd Annual Show and Ride on Friday morning. The early rising snowmobilers headed for the Naubinway Community Pavilion for a tasty break-

fast put on by the Top of the Lake Communities Association. By the time breakfast was over the temperature was up to around -11 degrees and everyone was good to go.

Over 90 antique and vintage snowmobiles were fired up and ready for the 22 mile round trip ride to the Cranberry Lodge located on the shores of Cranberry Lake on the Hiawatha Sportsman's Club. Once reaching their destination the riders all enjoyed a hot dog cookout. A few machines had mechanical difficulties and had to have some help getting home. As always, a big thanks to the Hiawatha Sportsman's Club for their hospitality.

Friday evening brought a new feature to the 23rd annual event. A group of 30+ antique and vintage machines with their riders and machines, decorated with Glow Sticks, gathered at the Museum and then left for a

parade tour of Naubinway. Then they headed out to the trails for a ride to the bridge on the pipe line trail and then back to the Museum. By Saturday morning, Old Man Winter had relented on the brutal temperatures of Friday and the sun was out with a balmy 12 degrees and very light



winds for the 23rd annual show. There was an excellent turnout of over 160 antique and vintage machines lining the display area in downtown Naubinway for the show on Saturday. It was exciting to see the great turnout of the featured Skiroule snowmobiles. Participants were able to visit the Community Center Pavilion throughout the day to enjoy chili and fixins prepared by the Big Mac Pack Snowmobile Club.

Later in the afternoon with machines safely tucked away, many participants headed to the Engadine/Garfield Township Hall for the closing banquet and festivities. It was great to see several new show participants. As usual, the hall was packed for the great meal prepared by Ethel Toms of the Beary Patch restaurant and for the remaining activities.

After dinner, the evening began with the Top of the Lake Community Association's silent can raffle. The drawing was held for the Grand Prize Snowmobile Raffle Drawing, which was won by Ethel Toms of Engadine, Michigan. Next, John McGuirk presented a short history of the show's featured Skiroule snowmobiles. The highlight of the presentation was the introduction of the Rokie and Lois Talentino family from Sault St. Marie, Michigan. Four generations were represented at the banquet. As a Skiroule dealer from 1967 through 1977, Rokie was once recognized as one of the best Skiroule dealerships in the U.S. His Skiroule snowmobile has been restored and is on display in the Museum.

The evening concluded with the annual banquet auction conducted by Ted Postula. (Thanks Ted for your great jobwe appreciate it.) The bidding was enthusiastic and brought in a great return for the benefit of the museum. The banquet concluded the official show and ride weekend and many were heard planning already for their return for next year show and ride. Skiroule and Rokie Talentino Story

Diana Talentino Mills and her brother, Jim Talentino, were at the show & banquet to honor their father, Rokie Talentino. Rokie owned the Skiroule that is on display in our museum. The Show and Ride weekend was also his birthday; Rokie passed away a few years ago.

Letter to the Museum from Diana Talentino Mills:

Our parents, Rokie and Lois Talentino, were visiting their daughter, Diana, in North Muskegon, MI in 1967. That is when Rokie first saw a Skiroule snowmobile in a race. From then on our father was all Skiroule. He returned home to the Sault and started to sell them in 1967. He became one of the largest dealers in three states (MI, WI and MN). selling them until 1977 when they were no longer being built.

Today we have 4 generations here in honor of our parents: myself, Diana, and husband Pat; brother, Jim and wife, Rose; grandchildren; Tony Talentino and friend, Leslie Combs; Terri Miller from Clovis, New Mexico - Terri just retired from the US Air Force after 20 years of service to our country; Great-grandson; Bradley and friends Rod Hesslick & Don Laitinen, who donated the Skiroule to the Museum.

This machine was given to Don by our father, and was told he wanted it to be shown. What better way to have it enjoyed and seen by a large number of people? Thank you Don Laitinan for giving it to the Museum.

It is a true honor to be here today. We know our parents would be so happy.

Students Interested in Snowmobile History

In January we received an email from Owen & Nathan from Chaska Middle School in Chaska, MN. They were working on their History Day project about Edgar Hetteen, the "grandfather of snowmobiling." They wanted to know how he lived and demonstrated leadership. I was more than happy to send them information that we had. You can find Museum stories on our Facebook page and on our Website.

MCACA Grant Awarded to the Museum:

The Museum was notified in March that they are receiving a matching \$3170 grant from MCACA (Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs) to restore a Waywego snowmobile that was made in Trenary, MI (thank you, John B, for writing the grant.)

Charlie found one about 15 years ago near Munising, MI, but had no idea what it was. It sat in his garage waiting to be discovered. Last fall there was a forum on Vintage Sleds.com about the Waywego. The owner of one in Manistique was trying to find out what it was.

The research began and we ended up talking to Will Webber, the grandson of Ralph Webber. Ralph built at least five of these machines in the 1960's in Trenary. Will has contacted the family looking for pictures or any other information. He brought the bodies and parts for three of these machines to Charlie and donated them to the Museum. We are restoring the machine that Charlie purchased many years ago and it will find a good home in the Museum. The "unveiling" of the restored Waywego will be during our Swap Meet/Auction,

March 9, 2015. These two adventurous souls, John Fromm and Ron Wenta, drove to the Museum from Rapid River, MI, on their 1967 Evinrude Skeeters! John and Ron are from Wisconsin, but John has a cabin in Rapid River, so they left the cabin at 4:00 am! They made it to the Museum at 3:00 pm, very tired, but still smiling! Whew!! They made the same trip last year, but extended it from two days to five days this year. They are planning on doing it again next year. This is part of the final story John wrote about their trip:

"We arrived back at the cabin at about 1:30 pm after logging 513 miles in 5 days. We would have been closer to 600 if trail conditions had held out at Whitefish Point and were able to get from Wetmore to Christmas. All in All a good run. Some stats of our trip: (per sled)

*About 55 gallons of fuel burned.

*Just over 2 gallons of OMC XD30 oil consumed

*Changed spark plugs after every day's riding- B7S=10 spark plugs. No other plugs were fouled or changed on the trip. *Average MPH: right around 20 in the wet sugary snow- around 25 in the mornings when the snow was firmed up from colder temps.

*The only issue we had was a broken POLARIS spring in John's slide rails. He had a spare and tools along and thanks to Curly's garage we had it changed out and left after only an hour delay."

New Addition to Museum Displays:

Talley Camp Polaris Sno-Traveler:

This 1961 snowmobile, powered by a 13 hp Onan engine, was used by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to tow the ice boring machines out onto the St. Mary's River, in Sault Ste. Marie, MI. It could tow up to 1500 lbs with two people on board. Sleds with dogs or horses were used to tow the equipment before the snowmobile came along. They drilled holes in the ice to determine how much

could be dredged from the river. In 1893, machinist James Strachan invented an ice auger enabling

two men to make as many holes as 15 could chop with an ax. This snowmobile made the project even that much easier. The Polaris Sno-Traveler has been at the Valley Camp Museum in Sault Ste. Marie for 25+ years and made its way to this museum in October, 2014.

New Volunteer - Tom Poole





Fundraiser for Bill Labadie

August 9th, 2014 Bill Labadie was helping a friend with a tree trimming project. He fell 35 feet when his safety harness broke. He was air-lifted to Marquette Hospital where he underwent emergency surgery. He ruptured his first lumbar vertebrae and fractured his second lumbar vertebrae.

The results of this type of injury are almost always paralysis. It was a successful surgery, but a couple weeks later, he was back in the hospital with a blood infection. In December, he

underwent another surgery. The cage that was originally built had slipped and was causing extreme pain. Doctors were able to operate and fix some of that. Bill continues to improve and he started pool therapy in February, 2015.

Bill is the son-in-law of Charlie & Marilyn Vallier and he has been a huge help with the Museum since its beginning. He is married to their daughter, Michelle, and they have a 9 year old son, Owen. Owen has also undergone surgeries and trips to Beaumont Hospital in Detroit for a genetic eye disease. In order to help the family with their astronomical medical and living expenses, "Team Labs" sweatshirts and t-shirts are being sold. You can contact the Museum if you would like to order some. Bill's nickname during his stay at the hospital became "Superman", so the Superman logo on the shirt comes in either grey or pink. Sweatshirts are \$25 and the T's are \$15.
