International Snowmobile Hall of Fame Inductees - 2021

Charlie & Marilyn Vallier -Explorers & Adventurers, Naubinway, Michigan

Charlie's obsession with snowmobiling began when his dad purchased a Hus-Ski 444 snow machine for him and his seven siblings to ride. After high school Charlie went into the Army where he met Marilyn, who had never been around snowmobiles before.

In 1971, Charlie talked his dad into starting a Viking dealership. His passion for snowmobiling was clearly contagious and Marilyn soon became acclimated to the sport as well. When Viking went out of business, they switched to a Scorpion dealership until Scorpion's demise in the early 80's.

With a strong passion for snowmobiles, Charlie was always finding and working on old sleds and became an active member of the Antique Snowmobile Club of America where he serves as a Director. Charlie had gained a personal collection of over 200 sleds. This is where his dream of having his own Museum began. Charlie and Marilyn first opened the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum on July 4, 2007 from a rented building they remodeled that once was a laundromat. It wasn't long before they filled that space and needed to relocate.

They broke ground on a much larger new building at what is now their current location, highly visible on Highway 2 in Naubinway. It opened in October, 2013. They dedicate most of their time to the Museum so it could be open to the public seven days a week. They quickly gained notoriety and the Top of the Lake Museum was recognized by SnowGoer Magazine as being the Best Snowmobile Museum in North America.

Currently the Museum is home to 185 snowmobiles and countless snowmobile related items. Charlie and Marilyn attend numerous vintage/antique snowmobile shows and swap meets throughout the Midwest. In order to raise funding for the Museum, they sell many snowmobile related items. The most popular of which is their signature wooden snowmobile rockers that engrain the idea of snowmobiling to the youngest of toddlers.

Charlie and Marilyn have several organized events annually. One example, always keeping the youth in mind and exposed to snowmobiling, they have "The Ride Your Sled to School Day." About 30 kids will ride their snowmobiles to school and when school lets out, Charlie leads them on a trail ride to the Museum. They have dedicated their lives not only to the preservation of snowmobile history but keeping the love for snowmobiles alive and fun. For this, Charlie and Marilyn Vallier are awarded induction in the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame, Class of 2021.

We asked the question - "What is that?", received the answer, and before we knew it we are new members. We even had our first Harvest Host campers two weeks after we signed up!

Harvest Host is a "Unique RVing Experience." The Hosts who sign up provide a spot for a RV or camper for free (electricity is a minimal charge by the Host,) but they are expected to go into the business and spend at least \$20. The business can charge if they are spending more than one night. There are three outside outlets at the Museum, on the back of the building, and 1 on the outside of the storage garage. 

Readers Words: From Andy Wells, designer of the Lil Andy

The small snowmobile in the photo is the first "LiL Andy" prototype. As a new employee in the engineering department, Allen Hetteen and David Johnson allowed me to develop my concept for designing a small new snowmobile to use the remaining Comet parts after the Comet production was ended early.

I began developing a small and light weight machine to fill an opening in the snowmobile market to young people. To keep the first prototype machine simple, I used a centrifugal friction clutch on the 6 HP Lawson motor and a direct chain drive from the clutch to the track drive shaft. The machine worked, but was slow and like always driving in low gear. Also, the clutch was prone to chatter at starting and stopping. Indeed, a tiller steering control was used, with the other hand secured to a grip attached to the bolts of the motor. Also, to my knowledge, this was the very first time a non-metal (fiberglass) hood was used on a snowmobile anywhere in the world since fiber glass was a new product back then. After a week of testing, I built the second prototype of the "LiL Andy" which had a variable shive clutch, jack-shaft, and more standard steering handle. More design was put into the hood also along with several other small track improvements. The entire "LiL Andy" development began in December of 1963 and ended in March of 1964, where the "LiL Andy" went into production.

6th Annual Snowmobile the Mighty Mac, Dec 11, 2021

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum in conjunction with The St. Ignace Visitors Bureau, are again offering a unique experience for antique and vintage snowmobile enthusiasts.

On Saturday, Dec 11th, snowmobiles, which must be a minimum of 25 years old and have front wheel kits that have a minimum 2" wide wheels, and no studs or cleats, will be allowed to drive over the Bridge under their own power. Snowmobiles need to be legally registered or have a Michigan Historic Registration sticker. Drivers must be at least 12 years old, with a Michigan Snowmobile Safety Class permit.

The cost to drive over the Bridge is \$35 which includes a lunch at the Little Bear Arena East in downtown St. Ignace. There is a smaller fee for passengers.

Participants will line up at the Colonial Michilimackinac parking lot in Mackinaw City. You must be there by 10 AM to unload your snowmobile and drive North to the Welcome Center to park your vehicles. A school bus will drive everyone South again. The drive over the Mackinac Bridge will begin at 11am. Lunch will be served at the Little Bear East Arena, downtown St. Ignace. The cost will be \$10 each for those who did not cross the Bridge.



Allis Chalmers Represents the Museum

This past Spring we had an unusual request from the Bobby Paulson family for the Allis Chalmers to make a trip to Hutchinson, MN for the 30th Annual Gathering of the Orange, Orange Spectacular Show, which was held the weekend of July 23-25th, 2021. It was sponsored by the Upper Midwest Allis Chalmers Club.

When the Bobby Paulson family brought it back, they were so excited to let us know they had 28,000+ people at their event over the weekend. They displayed our one-of-a-kind snowmobile, belonging to Doug Bonno, next to the very rare Allis Chalmers Fuel Cell tractor, which is on display at the McLeod County Historical Museum from the Smithsonian institute. It runs on electricity! In the early 60's Allis Chalmers worked with NASA to develop a way to power instruments on board space capsules. They also worked with the Atomic Energy Commission and experiments were done with a forklift that could lift 2,000 lbs and a fuel cell golf cart. None of the items went into production, but the research led to development of energy resources.



"This Allis Chalmers was built by Roy Stewart in 1965, one of three prototypes. Two were identical with the LLoyd OHV 4 stroke, 4 speed with reverse. The third one was built with a small cc 2 cycle engine and "didn't have enough power to pull itself." Allis was thinking about the work/utility sled market, not a sport machine. All of the mechanical components came off the assembly line, from various farm equipment, and the sleds were built during "down time".

After testing, it was decided that the sleds were not practical, and they were put in a disposal/scrap area. The gentleman I acquired it from and another employee from the Copper Country "rescued" both of the 4 cycle sleds from the scrap. The third sled was definitely scrapped out. The sleds were hauled to the U.P., one to Copper Country and the other one to his father's farm in Iron River, MI. The Copper Country sled was used for a short time, then junked, with the engine/trans given to the Iron River sled owner.

I was buying hay from the farm around 10 years ago, and the owner told me about the sled while my crew was loading hay. At the time, I was not into vintage sleds but I never forgot about it. I returned 2 years ago to find the owner suffering from Alzheimer's. He and his lovely wife agreed with me that it should be placed in a Museum, so I was able to purchase the Allis on that condition! I also have the engine out of the scrapped sled from Copper Country. I did contact Allis Chalmers for possible history on the sled, but was told, "We are a forward-thinking company and do not dwell on the past," so I was unable to get official documentation."

New Monument in Naubinway

The waterfront in Naubinway is home to a new marker recognizing the Northernmost Point of Lake Michigan. The Top of the Lake Communities Association (TOLCA) conceived and created the sculptural tribute that stands at Garfield Township Marina in Naubinway. Although the actual point is about two miles West of town, the marina is the most accessible and scenic location for the marker.

This Northernmost claim geographical fame is a point of pride and a way to celebrate Naubinway's long history as a fishing village. The stainless steel marker was fabricated locally and received the support of a matching-funds mini-grant from The Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA,) a grant from Graymont Community & Economic Fund, and donations from Cloverland Electric Co-Op and individuals. Donations of \$100 or more will be recognized at the TOLCA website, topofthelake.org.
