## 2022 Rear Engine Ride #7

Feb 15-17, 2022 by John McGuirk

For the seventh consecutive year a group of die-hard rear engine riders met the week before the museum's Winter Vintage Ride and Show for another attempt at riding 100 miles over three days.

Several riders who missed the 2021 ride due to Covid were able to return for the event. Fifteen rear engine machines representing four states joined the ride along with the support and safety crews.

This year the group rode three different types of terrain. One on the regular snowmobile trails, one on the beautiful Hiawatha Sportsman's Club trails, and one day off trails in the deep woods.

As of 2022, the group has ridden a total of 700 miles and is already looking forward to and planning for 2023. Breakdowns are encountered and mostly fixed on the trail with the occasional tow-in. Where will they go next???

Thanks to Charlie Vallier for acting as our guide and to Karen Jarema for being the support/safety trailing snowmobile along with Roland Smith who was our emergency breakdown tow sled.

# Vintage Electric Snowmobile on the Show Ride, Feb, 2022

Neil Swanson, from Prescott, MI, is all about electric. His house has 40 solar panels that he and his wife installed with their do-it-yourself mounting system, generating enough electricity for all his needs including heating his house and his hot water and he heats with a geothermal heat pump that they installed.

He converted a 1978 vintage Kawasaki motorcycle to electric two years ago, and wanted a similar project to enjoy in the winter. Neil grew up riding snowmobiles in his early years in Northern Michigan, so he really wanted to convert a vintage sled from his youth. Although he didn't ever have a Yamaha SS440, he really liked the styling. So, his first step was finding a used sled. It was not an easy

task. They were all in pretty rough condition and not inexpensive. But, in the end he found a reasonable 1980 model in late 2020 to start the project. He finished it in just two months. As you can see, the finished machine really looks nice. The color is actually the original factory red, less all the Yamaha decals. It has a range of more than 30 miles and can reach a speed of 37 mph. Neil brought his special machine to the Top of the Lake Show & Ride and made the 26-mile ride to the Cranberry Lodge. As you can guess, it drew a lot of attention.

## Snowmobile Clean Challenge – March 1-3, 2022

The SAE Clean Snowmobile Challenge is a yearly snowmobile event where Collegiate teams build and modify existing snowmobiles and compete in multiple events based on improvements in emissions and performance. The event this year was moved from Michigan Tech University in Houghton, MI to the Eagle River Derby Track in Eagle River, WI. Seventeen teams from all over the US and Canada were involved in the competition this year.

The first SAE Clean Challenge was held in 2000 at Jackson Hole, WY. The was moved to Michigan Tech University, Houghton, MI, in 2003. In 2006, a new category of "Zero Remissions" was added, supporting the need for engineering support for snowmachine vehicles in pristine areas. In 2007, another category, "Bio-Fuels was added. In 2009, the category for "Flex Fuel" was added. For 2022, the competition was moved to the World Championship Derby Headquarters in Eagle River, WI.

"As the results of the 3-day competition this year are being compiled, validation and data collection is a major part of the competition. As validation of designs both in industry and competition are the standard, the CSC utilizes a tow behind emissions data collection system that taps into the exhaust stream as well as into the snowmobile's fuel system for measurement. From there the students run through a predetermined in-service duty cycle towing the sled. Their score just like in industry is based on the quantitate results of this data collected. Although the scope of the design challenge is to optimize for reduced emissions, noise, and fuel consumption the students equally need to keep performance in mind. As the judges tested these sleds today on the subjective handling course to conduct a qualitative assessment of how the snowmobile rides, it's safe to say fun

after the competition to say they won a few awards, plus Best of Show! Great job guys and girls!!





## Warriors of Winter book

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum started in 2007 and from the very beginning there has been a gift shop with books for sale. ## Reader's Words by Jim Halfhill Jr – My First Snowmobiling Experience

"Bringing new riders into the sport is not something you're introduced to often, living in Kentucky. Luckily, my life's journey brought me in contact with a great friend and ambassador to the sport, Mr Charlie Cooper. Charlie was a family friend from when I was a kid, who always told stories of his adventures, including snowmobiling.

A few years after college in the fall of 2004, I called Charlie and told him I wanted to take him up on his offer to experience snowmobiling. I had never seen a snowmobile in person until I arrived at Charlie's house in February, 2005. He outfitted me with everything I needed and we drove from Dayton, OH to Bruce Mines, Ontario. This trip of 3 days was just the beginning of many trips to come. I was able to become the proud owner of a barely used 2005 Polaris Indy 600. If it wasn't for Charlie Cooper, I would probably never have experienced snowmobiling,



which I fell in love with instantly. He took the time to nurture a newcomer, loaned equipment, and showed me the ropes. Every year after that, Charlie and I made our own adventures. Unfortunately, Charlie went to heaven in November, 2019, but his legacy lives on through people he introduced to the sport he loved so dearly."

\*\*Marilyn's comment: The Museum part of this story is when Charlie Cooper came to the Museum in 2008 and saw a suit, exactly like his, hanging on the wall. His bibs were ripped and he asked me if he could trade them for the ones we had on the wall. I figured I would probably be in trouble, but I did make the exchange. He told me he would be back and would donate his jacket one day. A few years ago, he kept his promise. He delivered his suit with all the cool patches and his wife's suit for us to display in the new museum. Still today, they are displayed side-by-side.
