'64 Polaris K80D Snowmobile Donated

The Museum's latest snowmobile donation/addition is a '64 Polaris K80D, which was donated by John Mayer, a part-time resident of Curtis, MI.

The Museum received a MCACA grant to restore the sled, and Museum member, John Ketcher, did just that.

Many thanks to John and his sandblaster, Darin Butkovich!

This Pacer is the last of the Polaris Sportline styled sleds and the last of the primarily one-person Sno-Travelers to use the rounded nose section common to the smaller Sportline models.

The Pacer was produced for only the 1963 and 64 model years. Some models continued to be sold in 1965. The Pacer model was replaced by the Super Pacer in 1965. The K represented a Kohler engine and the 80 meant the motor was 8 hp. Top speed for the K-80-D was 25 mph and the machine weighed 435 lbs. The selling price in 1964 was \$835.
