

New Event: St. Ignace Tractor/Snowmobile Show

Earlier this summer the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum was contacted by the St. Ignace Chamber of Commerce to explore interest in holding a snowmobile show in conjunction with the Owosso Tractor Parts Antique Tractor Show. One of the highlights of the tractor show is the annual Mackinac Bridge tractor crossing, with over 900 tractors crossing the 5 mile long bridge.

The Museum jumped at the opportunity to hold a snowmobile show at the Little Bear Ice Arena in St. Ignace on Sept.

5th & 6th, 2014. For a first year event, the Snowmobile Show was deemed to be a huge success with eleven exhibitors from three states showing a great mix of antique and vintage snow machines.

A highlight of the snowmobile show was the 1944 Allis Chalmers M-7 Snow Tractor designed for use by the U.S. Army Air Corp as a rescue vehicle in Northern bases. Only 291 M-7s were made for war-time use. The Museum thanks Don and Julie Reinbold Jr. of Reese, Michigan for showing this awesome piece of history.

With the tractor show and ride concluding at the parking lot of the Little Bear Ice Arena, there was a very large turnout of visitors to the snowmobile show. The St. Ignace Events Committee sponsored awards in six categories. Winners were: Best Black Sled, Tim Nadler's 1975 Ski Doo 245 RV; Best Red Sled, Randy McEwen's 1963 Polaris Sno-Traveler; Most Unique Sled, Larry Bicigo's 1963 Trailmaker with an ice auger; Mayor's Choice, John McGuirk's 1942 Model B Eliason; Best Tractor Manufacturer, Larry Boyle's

wide track Wheel Horse Safari; and People's Choice, Don Reinbold Jr's 1944 Allis Chalmers M-7 Snow Tractor.

The show was also a big success in promoting the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum and many of the show's visitors showed interest in visiting the Museum. The Museum is looking forward to a return to St. Ignace in 2015.

1936 Westendorf

Fred Westendorf built this machine in 1936 to go ice fishing with on the Saginaw River in Zilwaukee, MI. It is the only one built. Fred was a machinist at Wicks Machinery in Bay City, MI.

Several of the features included retractable foot pegs. This made it possible for Fred to slide it into his Model A Ford. The rear drive wheel is spring loaded in the up position. When pressure is applied to the foot pegs, it moves the wheel on the back down, making contact with the ice or hard-packed snow.

The rear skis were widened for more flotation. The front ski was moved forward for better steering. The 1.5hp Briggs & Stratton engine was not powerful enough, so he bored it out to give it a little more power. This machine

was purchased from Fred at an auction by Dan Boyse's dad. He took it to a show where it received the nickname of the "Pizza Oven." Fred also built small steam engines and an operating tabletop sawmill.



In Memory of Bud Knapp (A Good Friend of the Museum) Snowmobile Hall of Fame Induction – 2002

Ernol "Bud" Knapp, Snowmobile Historian, started his interest in snowmobiling in 1965 and is internationally known for his vast personal wealth of information along with his well-known library related to snowmobiling. Bud's library may

be the largest collection of printed matter in the world pertaining to the history of snowmobiling.



His dedication to snowmobiling had led him to attend snowmobile shows, conventions, and congresses in both the United States and Canada. He served a term as Vice- President and President of the Antique Snowmobile Club of America (ASCOA). Bud helped produce a weekly show featuring old snowmobiles, called "Snowmobile Scene" along with a national television show known as "PM Magazine" which was produced in his home. Bud wrote columns and articles for the Michigan Snowmobiler Newspaper, American Snowmobiler Magazine, ASCOA Newsletter, Vintage Club of America Newsletter, and the Canada Antique & Classic Newsletter. Bud's snowmobile knowledge earned him the name of "The Professor" of snowmobiles. Sadly Bud passed away on April 15, 2014.

lightweight, yet very warm fiber. The cellular structure gives this fiber its softness. The alpaca has developed more thermal capacity in its fiber




than almost any other animal. We are getting the socks from an alpaca farm in lower Michigan. We hope to have more items available soon.
