couple. We hope to see them again at our Show and Ride next February!





The Anderson Snowmobile Mystery Solved!

The 1963 Anderson snowmobile is snow machine that Charlie's dad, Laurence Vallier, bought at a garage sale for \$5 about 30 years ago. Charlie went on a mission to find out what it was. I guess we could say that was the spark for the Museum idea, many years ago. Quite a few years later Charlie took it to a show in Manistique, MI and Melvin Anderson, whose father, Clay Anderson, built the machine, came up to him and told him the story behind it! Last year, Melvin was able to visit the Museum along with two men from Manistique. He brought some old pictures with him, which was very cool!

Now the rest of the story! Another brother, Wesley, visited the Museum on September 15 with his wife, Donna, and their daughter, Renee. Wesley & Donna live in Louisville, Colorado. Renee drove them to Manistique. Renee said it has been a great reliving the past with Melvin and they had to come to the Museum.

There were two more brothers, Howard and Lloyd, who worked on making the snowmobiles with their dad, Clay Anderson. They weren't sure how many snowmobiles they made because they used parts from one to make the new ones. During the Depression they would snowshoe to camp. When their dad saw a picture of a snowmobile, that was it! He got out some paper, drew up a design and they all went to work on it. All four boys became machinists. Wesley, now 86, worked for Dow Chemical and he & his wife, even went to China to work for a year after he retired. As you can see in the picture, they were very excited to see a piece of their history again.
