



Mackinac Bridge Crossing Dec. 17, 2016



Snowmobiles will be able to cross the Mackinac Bridge on Dec.17, 2106! Run to your garage, dig out the vintage sled, make sure it has a rubber track and enough gas to make the five-mile trip across the Bridge, and join us for an authentic Bucket List event!

The only requirements for the

snowmobiles are that they are 25 yrs & older, have at least 2" wide wheels (you don't want to get stuck in the expansion cracks!) and no cleats or studs. The machine also needs to be registered (either a regular license or the One -Time Historic license,) and riders need to wear a helmet.

This is the first year for this event, so please help us get the word out. The cost will be \$35 per sled, and includes the bridge fair and a lunch ticket for one of the three restaurants open in downtown St. Ignace. J. Armand Bombardier Addition Update

On May 10, 2013, the Top of the Lake Museum had a groundbreaking ceremony for a new museum on US 2. Three years later, on June 6, there was another groundbreaking ceremony for the J.A. Bombardier Addition! Twenty two people came to help us celebrate. Local speakers were; Don Butkovich, Garfield Twp Supervisor; Dean Brodberg, Top of

the Lake Communities Association President; Daryl Browning, representative for Graymont Limestone; and Jim Hill, Mackinac County Board of Commissioners Chairman.

The J. Armand Bombardier Museum in Valcourt, Quebec, gifted 33 rare and unique non-Ski Doo sleds to our Museum. We received the sleds in March, 2016. Museum staff and the Board of Directors immediately began plans to provide display space for them. The existing building was not deemed large enough to accommodate the sleds. After considerable study and planning, a 36' x 76' addition to the West end of the existing building was determined to be the best proposal. The Board of Directors approved the

proposal. The Board also gave approval for Museum staff to apply for grants to fund major portions of the addition with Museum funds to be used to supplement the grant funding. The overall project was to be completed in two phases. Phase I provided an unheated shell with in-floor heat, completed roofing and exterior doors with basic wiring preparation (cost \$63,000.) Phase II provided a heating boiler, electrical systems, insulation, outside siding, a library/media room, landscaping and concrete sidewalk and approach slabs (cost \$55,000.)

Grant applications were made to the 2016 Graymont Economic and Community Development Fund Grant program for Phase I for \$30,000.00 and the Michigan Council for the Arts and Cultural Affairs Grant program for Phase II for \$55,000. The Graymont Fund awarded \$30,000.00, and the MCACA Fund awarded \$24,750.00.

With the proposed 36' x 76' addition the final building will be the size that was originally proposed back in 2011/2012 but could not be accomplished with funding available at the time. (Note: The snowmobile trail still goes along the West side and South side of the Museum with more than enough room for proper grooming and riding.)

Work began on Phase I on June 12th and was completed on September 15th at a cost of \$63,234. Eleven contractors and 32 individual volunteers donated 719 hrs. of their time; and a donation of contractor labor time of \$7,290. Museum funds were used to supplement the Graymont Funds for Phase I.

Phase II work began on September 26 on the heating and plumbing system. Completion of the Phase II work is expected to be completed by the end of December with the library/media room, landscaping and outside concrete work completed next spring. Museum funds will supplement the MCACA grant for the completion of Phase II. The collection of Bombardier sleds will be displayed in the new addition along with a number of unique sleds currently in storage.

Donations for the addition can be made:

- 1) A \$1,000 CHALLENGE includes a life-time membership, or

The \$1,000 challenge currently totals \$17,000 and the "Any Domination" totals \$11,721. The Museum Board thanks everyone who has generously given of their time and/or money for the continuing growth of the Museum.


St. Ignace Tractor/Snowmobile Show—Sept 9 & 10, 2016

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum sponsored the Third Annual St. Ignace Snowmobile Show September 9 & 10, 2016 at the Little Bear East hockey arena in St. Ignace. The show was held in conjunction with the 9th Annual Tractor Show and crossing of the Mackinac Bridge. This year 1,326 tractors crossed the Mackinac Bridge for a new record.

The snowmobile show grew again this year with 15 participants showing 58 machines with a good mix of antique, vintage and vintage racing machines. With the

Featured Snowmobile for Issue #19: 1975 Ockelbo



This 1975 Ockelbo was one of the 33 Quebec snowmobiles donated by Bombardier. They had it in their museum. The Ockelbo sled began production in 1964 by the Ockelbo Industri AB in Ockelbo, Sweden. They were distributed in Sweden, Finland and Norway. None were sold in America as they were devoted to the European Continent. In 1970 they were the largest producer of snowmobiles in Europe. Many were used by reindeer breeders and for forest work.

This sled is powered by a 2 stroke Sachs 293cc fan cooled engine & weighs 353 lbs. Front & rear suspension is equipped with rubber bands for greater flexibility.

Over the years many different engines were used in the Ockelbo (JLO, Trioman, Sachs, Sachs Wankel, Lloyd, MAG (Motosacohe.) In 1975 Ockelbo was sold to Karolin Investi, who also bought Rajd Industri, AB Company, a rival snow-mobile. As a footnote, we have had 12 people from Sweden here and they were excited to see the Ockelbo! One man from Sweden even donated an Ockelbo hat.

Novi Show
