Snowmobiles Wanted for Guinness Book Record Challenge

If you have a snowmobile and the urge to help break a world record, The Sault Events has an invitation for you! On Thursday, Feb. 1, 2018, Sault Ste. Marie will attempt to break the Guinness World Record for most snowmobiles in a parade. The record was previously set in Whitecourt, Alberta, Canada, when 1,047 sleds participated in the parade.

Mary Jo Duvall, coordinator for The Sault Events, said the group has set its goal at 1,250 sleds, all of which must complete a full two-mile parade route to be counted for the record. "We are excited to mark the special occasion of 50 years of the I-500 with a record-breaking snowmobile parade on the Thursday before the main event," she explained.

The parade route will end at 25 e I-500 track, where participants can enjoy the beverage tent and a food truck competition while watching Thursday's race – The Woody's Challenge – a 25-lap sprint undertaken by qualifying pro racers.

Parade participants will receive free admission to Thursday's race with their parade bracelet and will enjoy free snowmobile parking at that event. To participate, all drivers will be required to have a valid driver's license and all snowmobiles must be registered. Proof of registration and driver's license will be required at registration. Kid's mini-sleds are not allowed to enter. Pre-registration is required. Register your sled at www.saultstemarie.com and be a part of history! Snowmobile the Mighty Mac - Dec 16, 2017

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum, in conjunction with The St. Ignace Visitors Bureau, is offering a unique experience for antique and vintage snowmobile enthusiasts. On Dec 16, 2017 antique and vintage snowmobiles, equipped with wheel kits, will be driving over the Mackinac Bridge for the second time. A special guest will be leading the pack across the Bridge this year. Jim Langley, from Denver, Colorado, first



crossed the Mackinac Bridge in 1966, (see related article below) and he has agreed to be the Grand Marshall this year! He is 80 years old now and will be driving his 1966 Polaris Colt, which makes this even more memorable for all involved!

Every year people, tractors, 4 wheelers, trucks, Mini Coopers, etc are given this opportunity. On Saturday (Dec 16th) snowmobiles will be allowed to drive over the bridge under their own power. The sleds must be a minimum of 25 years old, have front wheel kits that have a minimum 2" wide wheels, and no cleats or studs.

The cost to drive over the bridge is \$35 for each person, which includes a lunch at the Mackinac Grille in St. Ignace, your Bridge Fare and expenses to the Bridge Authority. There is an additional fee for a passenger. Machines will line up at the Colonial Michilimackinac parking lot in Mackinaw City (under the bridge.) You **must** have your sled unloaded by 10 am so you can drive to the North side Welcome Center where a bus will drive everyone back across to your sled. Everyone will be lining up at the Colonial Michilimackinac parking lot in Mackinaw City (under the bridge.) The drive over the bridge will begin at 11:00. Lunch will follow at the Mackinac Grille, downtown St. Ignace. People not crossing the bridge will be able to pay \$10 for lunch at the restaurant.

1966 Vancouver to Maine Story—the First Mackinac Bridge Crossing on a Snowmobile



Mitch Magnusson and Monica Dohmen, from MN, visited the Museum on April 1, 2017. During their visit, we discovered that Mitch and Monica were researching the 1966 Trans-Continental Snowmobile Adventure.

In 1966, two friends, Jim Langley and Clark Dahlin, decided to be adventurous and ride 1966 Polaris Colt snowmobiles from Vancouver to Maine. They completed their journey in 24 days—a total of 4,018 miles! When the Museum hosted our first Mackinac

Bridge Crossing, Dec 17. 2016, we learned that the two men crossed the Mackinac Bridge in 1966! We obtained a St. Ignace News article about the crossing, but it didn't mention anything about the huge trip these two men were making.

This is where it gets interesting. Mitch was in Roseau, MN where Jim and Clark made a stop on their adventure. Mitch had recently purchased 40 acres of land next to his farm and had found a snowmobile chassis on the property. He immediately suspected it was of one of those Polaris Colts. Monica took on the investigative work and has since found the 50-year-old picture of the stop the men made in Roseau. Mitch is the young boy in the picture (which is how he recognized the unique tail lights on the back of the sled!) Mitch and Monica also found and talked to Jim Langley, who now lives in Denver and is 80 years old. Monica has also talked to the policeman who escorted the duo from the West side of Maine to the Atlantic coast! Monica is attempting to contact the man who was in charge of the Mackinac Bridge when Jim and Clark crossed it. He had signed the snowmobile hoods along with several others signatures along the way. They are searching for information about the hoods of these machines. In addition, Monica is making a book for the Museum with pictures and articles about the trip!

We let them know we would love to have Jim be our lead snowmobile to cross the Mighty Mac this December. In September we learned that Jim Langley will travel from Denver to be the Grand Marshall of the 2nd Annual Snowmobile the Mighty Mac on Dec. 16, 2017! Jim will be riding on the 1966 Polaris Colt that Mitch found on his property and has since redone for Jim to ride. Jim is very excited about this adventure! Mitch and Monica will also be joining us.

Anyone is welcome to join us on this ride. You must register with the St. Ignace Visitor's Bureau. (See related story above) Note: We discovered that this story is in the Legends of Polaris book that we have for sale here.

The Bud Knapp / John McGuirk Library Dedication

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum held their annual Swap Meet on September 16th. During the event, the most recent addition to the Museum, The **Bud Knapp / John McGuirk Library**, was dedicated.

The dedication was to celebrate Bud and his great contribution to the history of snowmobiling, along with John and his collection. The dedication was attended by Gerri Knapp, Bud's widow, their son, Jerry Knapp, and their friend, Sue. The dedication was also attended by many snowmobile enthusiasts, Antique Snowmobile Club of America members, and friends of Bud & Gerri. Russ Sutton, former President of ASCOA happened to stop in and was thrilled to be part of the celebration.

The library is a huge compilation of historic snowmobile related information. There are five large book cases and seven large file cabinets full of manuals, brochures, and other detailed information for snowmobiles, engines, clutches, carburetors and many other snowmobile accessory items dating back to the 1950's and 1960's. The library is housed in a 12' x 20' room recently constructed within the main display area of the Museum.

Ernol (Bud) Knapp was a long time snowmobile enthusiast. He was the historian of the Antique Snowmobile Club of America and maintained a personal library of historic snowmobile-related documentation. Because of his extensive knowledge of snowmobiles and their related information he was often called "The Professor" by his fellow snowmobile enthusiasts. He was always available to field snowmobile related questions. Bud was very well known for his gracious willingness to reach into his wealth of information from his library and provide advice and even copies of detailed information that perhaps a snowmobile restorer needed as a key part of a project.

Bud donated his extensive library to John McGuirk and then John donated it to the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum to have it available to the public in an environment-controlled area.

J. A. Bombardier Addition Update:

We moved our expansion plans up and began work on an addition in June, 2016, due to the donation of 33 snowmobiles from the Bombardier Museum in Quebec.

We received a grant from the Graymont Foundation for Phase I, and then another grant from MCACA (Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs) grant for Phase II, which began in October, 2016. Phase I included the construction of the outer part of the addition and Phase II finishing the project.

With the two grants, the 24 people who donated \$1000 to the \$1000 Challenge, other private donations, and donated labor, we were able to complete the addition without borrowing any more money! We couldn't do it without You!

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum sponsored the 4th Annual Snowmobile/ Tractor Show on Sept. 8 & 9, 2017, at the Little Bear East hockey arena in St. Ignace, Michigan. The show is held in conjunction with the annual tractor crossing of the Mackinac Bridge. This year 1,466 tractors crossed the Mackinac Bridge for a new record!

The snowmobile show grew again this year with 20 participants showing 68 machines with a good mixture of antique, vintage and vintage racing machines. Most of the tractors were parked in the lot outside of the Arena. You can imagine how much fun the snowmobile guys had talking to the tractor guys about the machines! Top of the Lake Scenic Byway Dedication

On Oct 6, 2017 a dedication was held at the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum to celebrate the newest highway segment to be designated a Pure Michigan Byway under the state's rebranded scenic byway program.

The US-2 Top of the Lake Scenic Byway runs 85 miles from St. Ignace to Thompson, hugging the picturesque northern shoreline of Lake Michigan. It was chosen for the designation based on its outstanding recreational and scenic qualities.



Approximately 50 people attended the Dedication and Ribbon-Cutting. Speakers included: Dean Brodberg, President, Top of the Lake Communities Association (TOLCA); Aaron Johnson, MDOT; Sheila Aldrich, Manistique City Manager; Dave Nyberg, from Gov. Snyder's office; and Daniel Litzner, Mackinac County Board of Commissioners.

Cold Storage Garage is Up!

A 24' x 36' Garage / Storage Building was constructed in the back of the parking lot. It will be used to house approximately 41 sleds, maintenance equipment, and supplies owned by the Museum that are currently stored in members' facilities.

The Museum currently has 172 antique and vintage sleds on display. 135 of those are owned by others and 35 are owned by the Museum. The Museum owns a total of 74



sleds with 35 on display. The other 39 sleds not on display must be stored. The Museum display is changed regularly with sleds being rotated in and out. The new garage will provide the much needed space to store items such as sleds, snowmobile suits/helmets/boots, engines, parts, signs, and banners which are regularly donated to the Museum. Several of these are displayed but some are saved for the auction, raffle, door prize, or for sale at our two annual events with permission from the donor. Currently these items are stored off-site with our members. Now we can have them available at the Museum for viewing and hopefully sold. Another key item with minor usage is those members and enthusiasts who use the Museum facilities for drop off / staging for sleds and other items. An individual can drop off their items and store it in the garage until the other party picks it up. (John Batchelder)

Featured Snowmobile: 1965 Allis Chalmers



This Allis Chalmers was built by Roy Stewart in 1965, one of three prototypes. It is presently owned by Doug Bonno, (who provided us with this information) and displayed in the Museum. Two were identical with the LLoyd OHV 4 stroke, 4 speed with reverse. The third one was built with a small cc 2 cycle engine and "didn't have enough power to pull itself." Allis was thinking about the work/utility sled market, not a sport machine. All of the mechanical components came off the assembly line, from various farm equipments, and the sleds were built during "down time."

After testing, it was decided that the sleds were not practical and they were put in a disposal/scrap area. The gentleman who Doug acquired it from and another employee from the Copper Country "rescued" both of the 4 cycle sleds from the scrap. The third sled was definitely scrapped out.

The sleds were hauled to the U.P., one to Copper Country and the other one to his father's farm in Iron River, MI. The Copper Country sled was used for a short time, then junked, with the engine/trans given to the Iron River sled owner. Doug was buying hay from the farm around 10 years ago, and the owner told him about the sled while his crew was loading hay. At the time, Doug was not into vintage sleds but he never forgot about it. He returned two years ago to find the owner suffering from Alzheimers. He and his lovely wife agreed with Doug that it should be placed in a museum, so Doug was able to purchase the Allis on that condition! Doug also has the engine out of the scrapped sled from Copper Country. He contacted Allis Chalmers for possible history on the sled, but was told that "We are a forward-thinking company and do not dwell on the past," so he was unable to get official documentation.



Allis Chalmers Fans

On Aug 20, 2017, a group of tractor collectors from Minnesota stopped here to see the Allis Chalmers snowmobile. They traveled to the Oakley, MI Tractor Show, which also featured the "Gathering of the Orange" group. They have two meetings (gatherings) a year, in different parts of the country. They saw the article about the Allis Chalmers snowmobile in the Museum, which was in the Winter, 2015 issue of the "Old Allis News". When they found out they were going to Oakley this year, they made plans to stop at the Museum. The six

men were, Curt Anderson, Matt Wosmek, Harlan Engelman, Neal Gaarder, Scott Overgaard, and Gary Agrimson. Curt and his Crawler tractor were on the cover of that magazine, so he autographed it for us. What a great group of guys!

Quebec Author, Pierre Pellerin, Visits Museum

Pierre and Helene stopped to see us on August 1. Pierre Pellerin is the author of the "Snowmobile History" books. They were on a motorcycle trip to Yellowstone, Sturgis, Vancouver and back to Quebec. Peninsula Pathfinders Donation

Kelly Piar was here in August with some of his dad's Peninsula Pathfinders items, which are now on display in the Museum. J.D. Piar was one of the original Pathfinders. The Peninsula Pathfinders were organized in the late 1960's by Ray Frieberg of Marquette, MI. The primary goal of the group was to participate on long distance trail rides to help promote the need for snowmobile trails and a trail network, and to demonstrate that snowmobiles could be used for long distance trips. One of their first rides was from Ironwood, MI to Sault Ste. Marie in 1968. They rode from Marquette to West Yellowstone twice and from Marquette to Maine where they rode into the Atlantic Ocean (1972?)! They were also one of the first snowmobile groups to cross the Mackinac Bridge. They traveled from Marquette to a winter festival in lower Michigan. In 1974, 10 members made a trip to Finland – 12,700 miles plus 670 kilometers by snowmobile!

In the late 60's, Larry Jorgensen was an assistant new director for a television station in Green Bay (WFRV-TV). John Ireland was an engineer at the same station and they both were hooked on snowmobiling. They decided to put on a show for snowmobiles. It was the first consumer expo in the Midwest (possibly the first in the nation).

To help promote snowmobiling and the show, they were able to participate on several of the Pathfinder's trips. They did not make the Finland trip. Larry also thought the group wanted to travel to Russia and had received preliminary approval, but the trip was later cancelled.
