


#### 16th Annual Top of the Lake Swap Meet, Sept 17, 2022

Vallier finished, "But, when all is said and done, we really do need the money we

make. So, I want to thank all of those who came here and helped us. Both the people who brought items to sell or trade, or just the people that stopped in and even just looked around. This all helps us to be able to continue to keep the doors open."

Also talking about this was Tony Cerne, from L'Anse Michigan. He stated, "I love this event. I've been coming here for years. I've been going to Swap Meets and Shows for years and have been to a lot of places. This one is one of the best. They have an incredible facility here, and the people are really great. That is why I keep coming back every year. It is just a whole lot of fun."

Dana & Jannis were here a couple months ago and Dana decided to put his 1972 Thunder Jet in the Museum that belonged to Jim Adema. the Sno Jet racer who knew how to make a Thunder Jet go faster than anything else!

Jim was the first person to move the engine farther forward and to the left on the race sleds and this machine is famous for the water-cooling jacket he made around the engine. This was a first for engines in 1972. Dana has owned this machine for 20+ years and found it in the back of a machine shop.

We had been looking forward to them coming back with the sled. Charlie had a spot waiting for the Thunder Jet and it turned out to be perfect, especially with the large sign that Dana had made to display with the sled. To top it off, Bernie & Brenda Blain and their grandson came, too. It was so interesting listening to the guys talking about the history of this machine and Jim Adema, and of course, their stories. She also walked around the Museum with Charlie and seemed to be impressed with what we have here. She told us she feels good that it's here. Thank you Patty, we are honored to share it!"

#### 7th Annual Snowmobile the Mighty Mac, Dec 10, 2022

The Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum in conjunction with The St. Ignace Visitors Bureau are offering a unique experience for antique and vintage snowmobile enthusiasts. On Dec 10, 2022 antique and vintage snowmobiles, equipped with wheel kits, will be driving over the Mackinac Bridge.

On Saturday, Dec 10th snowmobiles, which must be a minimum of 25 years old and have front wheel kits that have a minimum 2" wide wheels, will be allowed to drive over the bridge under their own power. They also will need a current permit

or Historic Registration sticker. The cost to drive over the bridge is \$40 and includes a lunch at Little Bear East Arena in downtown St. Ignace. The cost for a passenger is \$35. Others not crossing may purchase a lunch ticket for \$15.

Participants will be lining up at the Colonial Michilimackinac parking lot in Mackinaw City. You must be there by 10am to unload your snowmobile, then drive north to the Welcome Center, where a school bus will drive everyone south again. The drive over the bridge will begin at 11am. Once you have crossed the bridge, you will load up in the Welcome Center and drive to the Little Bear East Arena for lunch and awards.

The "Snowbike" from Moonbikes is an eco-friendly alternative to gaspowered, noisy snowmobiles

#### "Moonbike" Hopefully Makes an Appearance at the Feb. Show!

Battery powered vehicles are not just for the auto industry. Companies around the world are developing new zero emissions recreational electric vehicles such as motorcycles, ebikes, mopeds, ATVs and scooters. But French startup Moonbikes is the first to develop an all-electric take on the gas-powered snowmobile the company calls a "Snowbike."


It represents an entirely new way to traverse snow covered trails and explore the outdoors in the winter months. MoonBikes aims to change winter recreation with its unique electric Snowbike. The company says its takes only fifteen minutes to learn how to operate it. The Snowbike allows people to explore the outdoors with an emission-free vehicle that

can help establish sustainable tourism in the mountains in the winter, according to Moonbikes. As a vehicle with the maneuverability of a bicycle and the power of a motorcycle, MoonBikes' only disturbance is the tracks made on the snow. If you are a winter and snow enthusiast looking for new ways to adventure, MoonBikes is for you."

The Snowbike is equipped with a caterpillar track on the rear wheel like a military tank. While the front wheel of the Snow Bike has been replaced by a tiny snowboard instead of a tire. The bike can travel effortlessly over snow and is designed as a more eco-friendly alternative over gas-powered snowmobiles. The electric powertrain of the Snow Bike is also silent, so it won't disturb the peacefulness of the great outdoors.

It gives users the freedom of an e-bike, with the power of a motorcycle to travel over snow. The bike has a top speed of 26 mph and can operate in temperatures as low as -13 degrees Fahrenheit. Charging the Snowbike can be done by connecting a charging cable directly to the MoonBike or removing the battery to charge it at home. Charging takes five hours and 45 minutes using a standard charger and three hours with an optional fast charger. Range is measured by time instead of distance. The Snowbike can operate anywhere from 60 to 90 minutes (up to 22 miles), depending on which operating mode the rider selects. The choices are "eco" and "sport."
